AN ACT TO authorize the President to award the Medal of Honor to the unknown American who lost his life while serving overseas in the Armed Forces of the United States in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam Era and has been selected to be buried in the Memorial Amphitheater at Arlington National Cemetery.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the President may award, and present in the name of Congress, the

Medal of Honor to the unknown American who lost his life while serving in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam Era as a member of the Armed Forces of the United States and who has been selected to lie buried in the Memorial Amphitheater of the National Cemetery at Arlington, Virginia, as authorized by Section 9 of the National Cemeteries Act of 1973, (Public Law 93-43).

Approved May 25, 1984, Public Law 98-301, Ninety-eighth Congress.

Pro Athletes in the Military

There's something about the world of professional sports that can feel like a different universe. Athletes, with their immense talent and dedication, seem to live lives far removed from the rest of us. But for a surprising number of these elite competitors, their journey to the top of their game included a detour through the military. These stories offer a powerful reminder that before (and sometimes after) they were sports icons, they were soldiers, sailors, and airmen, facing a different kind of pressure and answering a higher call to duty.

One of the most well-known modern examples is Pat Tillman. An All-American at Arizona State, he was a hard-hitting safety for the Arizona Cardinals when the September 11th attacks happened. In the wake of that tragedy, Tillman made a life-altering decision: he turned down a multi-million dollar contract extension to enlist in the U.S. Army. He served as an Army Ranger and was tragically killed in Afghanistan in 2004. His story is a testament to sacrifice and an enduring symbol of a life lived with unwavering principles. But Tillman's story is just one of many.

Baseball legend Jackie Robinson is rightly celebrated for breaking the color barrier in Major League Baseball, but before he took the field for the Brooklyn Dodgers, he served in the U.S. Army during World War II. While he never saw combat, his military service was not without its own battles. He

segregated bus, a defining moment that foreshadowed his later fight for equality in sports and society.

Another remarkable tale of perseverance comes from Rocky Bleier. A running back for the Pittsburgh Steelers, he was drafted into the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War. While on patrol, he was seriously wounded by a grenade and rifle fire, with doctors telling him he would never play football again. Undeterred, Bleier worked tirelessly to rehabilitate and returned to the Steelers, not only playing but becoming a key contributor to four Super Bowl championships. His journey from the battlefield to the Super Bowl stage is nothing short of inspirational.

And then there's Roger Staubach, a man who won the Heisman Trophy at the Naval Academy in 1963. After graduation, he had a mandatory four-year active duty commitment to the Navy, including a tour of duty in

Vietnam. He put his football career on hold for a time, but it clearly didn't hurt his game. After his service, he joined the Dallas Cowboys and led them to two Super Bowl victories, earning the nickname "Captain America" for his on-field heroics and patriotic service. These are just a few of the many athletes whose stories intertwine with military service. They are a powerful reminder that the qualities we admire in them on the field—discipline, teamwork, courage, and a relentless work ethic—are often the very same qualities that are forged and tested in a different, more serious arena. They are heroes in more than one uniform.
