The U.S. Army has released the names of the four soldiers killed last week when their military helicopter crashed in Washington state. In a news release Sept. 22, the Army identified the victims as chief warrant officers Andrew Cully, 35, of Sparta, Missouri; Andrew Kraus, 39, of Sanibel, Florida, and Sgts. Donavon Scott of Tacoma, Washington, and Jadalyn Good, 23, of Mount Vernon, Washington.

The crash happened in a rural area near Joint Base Lewis-McChord about 9 p.m. local time on the night of Sept. 17. Officials said the helicopter was on a routine flight training west of the base, about 20 miles south of Tacoma, Washington.

Vietnam War - U.S. Marine Corps JAMES ANDERSON JR

CITATION

For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty. Company F was advancing in dense jungle northwest of Cam Lo in an effort to extract a heavily besieged reconnaissance patrol. Pfc. Anderson's platoon was the lead element and had advanced only about 200 meters when they were

brought under extremely intense enemy small-arms and automaticweapons fire.

The platoon reacted swiftly, getting on line as best they could in the thick terrain, and began returning fire. Pfc. Anderson found himself tightly bunched together with the other members of the platoon only 20 meters from the enemy positions. As the firefight continued several of the men were wounded by the deadly enemy assault.

Suddenly, an enemy grenade landed in the midst of the marines and rolled alongside Pfc. Anderson's head. Unhesitatingly and with complete disregard for his personal safety, he reached out, grasped the grenade, pulled it to his chest and curled around it as it went off. Although several marines received shrapnel from the grenade, his body absorbed the major force of the explosion. In this singularly heroic act, Pfc. Anderson saved his comrades from serious injury and possible death. His personal heroism, extraordinary valor, and inspirational supreme self-sacrifice reflected great credit upon himself and the Marine Corps and upheld the highest traditions of the U.S. Naval Service. He gallantly gave his life for his country.

Forever on Duty: Spirits in Uniform

Every veteran knows the commitment: the oath, the uniform and the unspoken bond that extends many years beyond your DD-214. But for some, that commitment is truly forever.

Across America's oldest posts and historic vessels, there are quiet but persistent stories of the service members who, for reasons known only to them, never quite left their last assignment.

These aren't terrifying tales meant to frighten; they are powerful reminders of unwavering devotion.

Consider the ghostly sentries at **Fort Riley, Kansas**. After the devastating 1918 flu pandemic, the post experienced the loss of many soldiers. To this day, witnesses report seeing a lone soldier in a WWI-era uniform, still carrying his rifle on his patrol route near the site of old **Camp Funston**, only to instantly vanish. He isn't looking for attention; he's simply on duty.

The Navy has its own enduring watch-standers. The USS Arizona Memorial, a place of immense historical significance, is also a site of continuous, unexplained activity. Visitors often describe feeling a profound, inexplicable wave of sadness or a strong sense of



presence while standing over the wreck. Below them in the deep brackish water of **Pearl Harbor**, over a thousand sailors along with 218 Army soldiers and 109 Marines remain entombed, their duty never ending.

On the decommissioned carrier USS Hornet, former crew and museum staff routinely report shadowy figures in vintage uniforms and tools that move on their own, as though a crew is still performing maintenance checks. From the quiet barracks of Fort Leavenworth, where General Custer is rumored to still appear for inspections, to the isolated jump towers of Fort Moore, where a tragic accident left a permanent, shadowy figure, the stories persist.

For veterans who understand military service and the perpetual sense of honor and duty,

these lingering shadows feel less like a haunting and more like the ultimate, ongoing commitment - Forever

in uniform, forever on duty.


